- i. Unless specified otherwise (point iii below), please apply for an internship with a host organisation by submitting (1) the LCIS application form, (2) your resume (CV), and (3) a cover letter, to the Coordinator of the Language and Communication programme, preferably as electronic documents, to lisalim@hku.hk.
- ii. The application deadline for all host organisations (except for HKUP) is Thursday 15 November 2012, 5pm. The deadline for HKUP is (extended to) Tuesday 13 November 2012, 12 noon
- iii. For Little Trekkers Learning Club, a cover letter is not required.
- iv. If you are applying to more than one host organisation, please submit a separate LCIS application form for each, as these will be forwarded to the different organisations.
- v. The host organisations will conduct interviews as part of the selection process.

Notes on the summer internships:

i. For iLearner, Hong Kong University Press, and Little Trekkers Learning Club, summer internship positions are also available. Details of these will be provided next semester (around February/March 2013). What may be noted now is that students in the semester internships will have the possibility of extending their internship through the summer. Organisations often seek continuation, subject to satisfactory performance on the part of the student intern, since this means that the student interns will already be familiar with the workings of the organisation.
